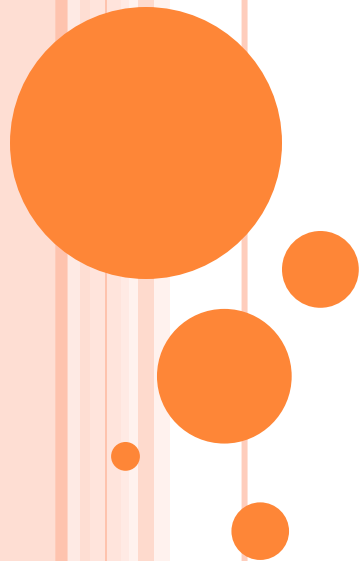

MICHIGAN SLP LICENSURE

- December 7th deadline:

All SLPs in Michigan must be licensed by this date. Under the Public Health Code, practicing as a Speech-Language Pathologist without a valid license after December 7, 2013 is a felony and may result in legal proceedings.

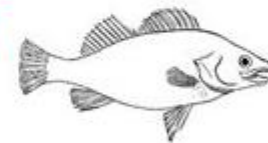
